The splendor of the first view of the lagoon upon arrival at the site (1): the visual prominence of parking so close to the lagoon, so disappointing




The wonder of the first view on the lagoon upon arrival on the site (2): the magical removal of parking, thanks to photoshop!



The promise is somewhat spoiled...









The glacier has

giving the banks of the lagoon a rough terrain.










Consensus on the poor quality of present infrastructure. Interpretation boards are definitively not in a good place!



The panels are soberly placed on the blocks. Is the information well positioned in front of the iceberg spectacle?


The panels of the photos are stranger. Why burden an exceptional landscape with photographs of other landscapes?




From the upper terrace, a first perception of the old alluvial plain from which pieces of ice emerge, strange and unusual.




As you move forward, the lagoon is revealed, the blocks float!

A glacier was flowing into the sea. Manhandled.


It retracts, withdraws, exhausts itself, leaving behind the memory of old channels and orphan moraines.

A way seeks to cross this intimate connection by the glacier by the waves, by a bridge, another bridge, fragile link, risky place of a journey around the island, way of transport, energy, memory of horses in the waves, the junction point between two flows.

How on this site to evoke the power of these relationships, to bring them to life from the inside, outside in direct connection with the elements, to make it a physical, symbolic experience, to live it in contact with the stone, the water of ice, rain, sun, wind






September 5, 2021 The periglacial alluvial terrace reveals its secrets thanks to Snoevarr



September 9, 1927 The glacier suddenly calves, releasing both enormous blocks of ice and a large quantity of water. Like ephemeral icebergs, the ice is scattered across the river bed.



The blocks come to a standstill when the waves calm








The beautiful stone staircase and pathway were built by volunteers, under the supervision of the Environment Agency and the National Park. A very good example of a sober construction, using local materials.



A suggestion to lighten the work. Every detail counts.








The contemplation of this extraordinary landscape puts everyone in a state of calm, of floating concentration, of sensitive attention.

Sometimes one of them turns in anger against the men whose inconsistency will put an end to their mother glacier, the spirit of Iceland.




In the lobby of Fosshotel Glacier Lagoon: Jokulsarlon inspires artists.




View from the lagoon: On the ridges, all the elements stand out strongly on the horizon. On the ridges, or on the top of the alluvial terraces, all the elements stand out strongly on the horizon. This should be borne in mind when choosing the location of the future car park and visitor centre.



This plastic will inevitably end up in water and soil. The ecological impact of developments must be taken into account.



















Strange little benches remain discreet. Their material, wood, remains out of step into places without wood or forest

Principles for the landscape intentions scheme of Jökulsárlón

I - Spread out the public without fixation point to promote a calm and solitary perception

2 - Make the installations (buildings, parking, etc.) discrete from the paths, the water, the road


3 - Respect the traces of the old glacial flows and rely on these natural structures for the design of the installations

4 - Promote the discovery on foot and not by bus even electric, and offer loops of different lengths


5 - Concentrate interpretation and information on the reception center and on a few singular places (end of the dike, abutment of the bridge, etc.)

Five key points for the further "Landscape Intention Scheme" in Jokulsarlon, based on the writings of participants in the workshop.





Present Master Plan: the implantation of the parking, visitor center and facilities is planned in the high terrace. They will be very visible. And their distance from the lagoon will make it systematic to travel by a shuttle, and will necessitate the creation of additional facilities (bus stop, shelter, toilets...) at the edge of the lagoon.




A suggested layout on the middle terrace dated 1894, inspired by Icelandic cliffside houses. With a much lower impact, the landscape insertion is much better.






New road n°1 and bridge as planned



Proposal: implantation of the parking in a lower terrace. Less visible from the lagoon and from road 1, and making it possible to discover the site by walking for the great majority of the visitors.



Proposal: implantation of all facilities in a lower terrace. Less visible from the lagoon and from road 1, and making it possible to discover the site by walking for the great majority of the visitors.



Proposal, with pedestrian trails: a site to be discovered by walking, as the shuttle for disabled people does not cross the site. What a great experience for the visitors!
